HSUHK confers Honorary University Fellowships on five distinguished individuals today

The five recipients are: Ms Suzanne Chan Shet-hung, Mr Thomas Ching Wing-hong, Ms Tong Hing-min, Mr Tsang Wing-wah and Dr Yip Kit-chuen.

In his opening address, Professor Simon S M Ho, President of HSUHK, congratulated the five Honorary University Fellows, saying, “The outstanding individuals we honour today are not just leaders in their professional fields, they are beacons of inspiration who have transformed challenges into opportunities.
