# TEACHING AND COMMUNITY EDUCATION



Sustainability education is the foundation for preparing students to see the connections between what issues need to be addressed, the values that influence why we should act, and the skills that provide the insights on how to act.

## SELECTED RESEARCH

The Research Centre for ESG (CESG) was created in 2020/21, to facilitate academic research, conduct knowledge transfer, and educate the community about ESG and business sustainability. Currently, the research of the Centre is funded by the Institutional Development Scheme of the Research Grants Council (RGC) of Hong Kong. The four research components are: (1) Incorporating social returns into the ESG integration process, (2) Improving KPIs of ESG reporting for listed firms, (3) Measuring consumer satisfaction on ESG performance, and (4) Enhancing the effectiveness of strategic corporate communication on ESG effort for listed firms.







## COMMUNITY OUTREACH

#### Institute for Youth Sustainability Leadership (IYSL)

IYSL at The Hang Seng University of Hong Kong aspires to be one of Hong Kong's major initiatives for mobilising young people to achieve the United Nations' Sustainability Development Goals (SDGs) through youth education and empowerment. The Institute aims to be a hub for sharing knowledge, expertise, and resources of sustainability development with various stakeholders in the wider community.

#### (i) University Scholars Leadership Symposium (USLS) 2023

As a global exposure of HSUHK's commitment to SDGs and youth leadership, six HSUHK students attended the 11th University Scholars Leadership Symposium (USLS) 2023 at United Nations Conference Centre, Bangkok, Thailand from 1-4 August 2023, via the arrangement and support by IYSL and VPLSE. The symposium was organised by Humanitarian Affairs Asia, an international NGO networking young leaders for global initiatives and development.

Our students shared their views on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and related issues with hundreds of delegates from various parts of the world.

### Community Activities by other Offices / Schools / Departments

Honours Academy (HA) organised a Global Immersion Programme (GIP) in Singapore in collaboration with the Residential College 4 of The National University of Singapore (NUS) in 2023, focusing on the themes of Housing and Social Policy, Technology and Economy, Youth and Community, and Cultural Diversity.

As part of this immersive experience, students had the opportunity to visit significant sites, including Marina Barrage and the NEWater factory, to gain an in-depth understanding of Singapore's water management strategies and the importance of sustainable water solutions. Through these immersive experiences, students not only broadened their knowledge but also developed a global perspective on addressing water challenges and promoting sustainability in their own communities.





The "Food Waste and Us" project, led by Honors Academy (HA) students from the 1st and 2nd cohort, aimed to raise awareness and promote sustainable practices within the Residential College (RC) community. Inspired by their HA Global Immersion Programme in Singapore, the students had decided to focus on the topic of food waste. The project ignited a sense of responsibility and promote a culture of sustainable living within the RC community by raising awareness about waste management, understanding food waste, and exploring the importance of contributing to society and the environment.





Co-operated with the Department of Art & Design (AAD) and Human Ip, a local artist, a watercolor leaf printing workshop was hosted and a part of the findings of this nullah opposite the HSU campus was exhibited at Space for All in HSUHK Library.




## In Between Self-Reinforcing Strength & Co-Creation by artists Mok Yat-san and Man Fung-yi, and curated by Chan Sai-lok, in Library.

This exhibition theme revolved around mindfulness, mental health, and community art, all stemming from Mok and Man's self-scrutiny in delving into their 'Heartfield' in Chiang Mai, Thailand. The act of 'planting' serves as a metaphor for the daily practice of selfreflection and perceiving the fundamentals of life cycles. Drawing inspiration from nature, the artists had created this series of works incorporating recyclable bamboo.







Rising to speak for sustainability education, campaigns about knowledge transfer have been launched. Within the Library's Book Crossing, 80% of books were selected by HSUHK community members, they were widely shared in 6 different regular points in Campus. A free-totake concept has been applied to this initiative, 1037 books were shared within the whole academic year.

The English Language Centre (ELC) and Institute for Youth Sustainability Leadership (IYSL) co-organised a competition titled "Inter-Institution Edutainer Competition: UN Sustainable Development Goals". This competition aimed to recruit contestants to produce short English videos that raise awareness about one of the following UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) in an educational and entertaining way:

SDG 4: Quality Education
SDG 5: Gender Equality
SDG 10: Reduced Inequalities
SDG 11: Sustainable Cities & Communities
SDG 12: Responsible Consumption & Production
SDG 13: Climate Action
SDG 14: Life Below Water



On 19 March 2023, the Institute for Chinese Language and Culture (ICLC) held a workshop called "Rice Culture and Farming Experience" in the agricultural fields of Pat Heung in Yuen Long. Dr Chow Sze Chung and Ms Kitty Hung from the "Sangwood Kids Club" introduced the traditional farming skills and practices.

By participating in traditional agricultural activities, participants gained first-hand experience with sustainable practices, understood how local farms could operate in an environmentally friendly manner that conserves resources and protects the land for future generations. The workshop also emphasised natural methods and rehabilitation of the soil, which are key tenets of sustainable agriculture.





On 25 February 2023, a visit to the local organic farm in San Tin was organised for students of GEN2011 Plants and Civilisation (launched under Department of Social Science for Semester 2, academic year 2022/23). Students not only learned about the operations of local organic farms and the challenges brought by climate change, but also got a taste of the countryside in Hong Kong.

The Talent Development Scheme was launched under School of Decision Sciences in academic year 2022/23 with two workshops organised: (i) Time Management & (ii) Personality Dimensions. The aim of the TDS is to enrich students' learning experiences outside the classroom with the following four objectives:

- Enlighten future
- Enrich learning experiences
- Equip employability and leadership skills
- Enable collaboration for projects and competitions



By participating in the Service-Learning Programme under Department of Mathematics, Statistics and Insurance, two groups of BSc-DSBI Year-4 students analysed the data provided by Food Grace, a non-profit charitable organisation focusing on food recycling, and presented their findings on 12 January 2023 at Food Grace. In addition, they visited the company with teachers to learn about their workflow of food recycling and the data collection methods.
